
In the United States, accreditation is a key measure used to identify institutions and programs that provide a high-quality education.



Master of Science in Education: Educational Leadership - MSEd-EL

This 30-credit Master of Science in Education - Educational Leadership prepares teachers with the foundational knowledge to pursue a career as an K-12 assistant principal or principal and is an approved program for preparation for the Building Administrator (040) endorsement in the State of Maine.

This educational leadership program is ideal for teacher leaders that want to make an impact in their school and move into a more formal leadership role of a department head, assistant principal, or principal. Although teacher leaders may not be ready to step out of the classroom yet, they will have the skills required to lead when the time is right in their career to assume a position of greater responsibility.

Master of Science in Education - Inclusion Education - MSEd-IE

This 30-credit hour Master of Science in Education - Inclusion Education program prepares you to become a special education teacher. The 282 Endorsement earned will correspond to the educator's current level of teacher certification in the State of Maine (i.e. 282E-Elementary K-8 or 282S-Secondary 7-12).

Within this program, students will learn co-teaching instructional practices, data analysis, how to model, teach, and nurture behavioral skills, and much more. Our faculty members include highly qualified and experienced educators with first-hand knowledge of inclusion best practices.

An inclusive classroom provides students with disabilities the opportunity to learn alongside their peers in age-appropriate, general education classrooms. Integrating students with disabilities into a general education classroom is a challenging but worthwhile endeavor. Our program strives to give you the skills to successfully lead an inclusive classroom.

This 36-credit hour Master of Science in Education - Reading Specialist program prepares you to become a Reading Specialist in a K-12 setting. This program is approved preparation for Literacy Specialist Certification (092) in the State of Maine.

This program is designed to equip you with the foundational knowledge that you need to assess students and to provide targeted literacy instruction. It prepares you to take a leadership role in your school and districts to support fellow educators in their goal of improving students' literacy growth.

Through coursework that engages you in collaborative relationships around issues in literacy education, you will explore the dispositions, knowledge, and skills that literacy leaders need to be successful.

Certificate of Advanced Graduate Study - CAGS

This 30-credit Certificate of Advanced Graduate Study program allows you to concentrate on any combination of 10 courses that are most closely applicable to the area in which you are working or that interests you. Additional focus is placed on instructional leadership and tools to use to effectively motivate and lead teachers.

This program does not align with any particular state certification requirements, and is generally used to study an area of interest.

Certificate of Advanced Graduate Study in Advanced Educational Leadership

This 30-credit Certificate of Advanced Graduate Study in Advanced Educational Leadership (CAGS AEL) program is an online educational leadership certificate that provides a thorough foundation in educational leadership theory, principles, and practices.

Emphasis is on developing the knowledge and skills needed by school administrators and other educators who wish to assume significant leadership roles in their schools, educational institutions and communities.

Unlike the CAGS program outlined on the previous page, this program requires completion of 10 **specific** courses (30 credits).

Please note: In the State of Maine, this CAGS leads to a Principal – Building Administrator Certificate (040). If you will be working outside of the State of Maine, UNE Online highly recommends that you research your specific state requirements for entry level into assistant principal or principal positions before entering this (or any) program. Doctor of Education - Ed.D.

The Doctor of Education (Ed.D.) provides collaborative learning opportunities throughout the program from day one, offers multiple start dates per year, includes a dissertation, and is completed entirely online with no residency requirement.

Please note: If your goal is to become an Administrator in the State of Maine, and you currently have your master's degree, the 30-credit CAGS in Advanced Educational Leadership is the program that would lead to Building Administrator 040 certification in the State of Maine

If you will be working outside of the State of Maine, UNE Online highly recommends that you **research your specific state requirements** for entry level into assistant principal or principal positions before entering this (or any) program.

CURRICULUM STRUCTURE

The online Ed.D. program design specifically supports your development as a leader through formal study of your organization, participatory research processes, and collaborative decision making. Professionals engage in:

- Instruction that includes online lectures, instructor-led discussions and assessments, small group interactions, and limited, optional synchronous sessions.
- Preparation outside of class that includes readings, project development, and applied research.
- Completion of a culminating dissertation that employs your professional knowledge and new learning.

DISSERTATION SUPPORT

As a doctoral student, you will begin to work on your dissertation from the beginning of the program, starting with a description of a potential research topic in the admissions essay. That same topic (or another one, if chosen and approved within the first two courses) is further explored and developed into a dissertation proposal throughout each of the eight dissertation development courses included within the program . throughout the first year of the Ed.D.

Ed.D. students refine their topic exploration into a dissertation proposal. This means if a doctoral student successfully meets all the benchmarks in each course, by the time a student is assigned a dissertation committee (lead and secondary advisor) they will have already written a solid draft version of the three chapters proposal of their five-chapter dissertation.

The embedding of the dissertation within the entire Ed.D. curriculum is a unique advantage in the program at UNE Online, and is a major reason why the program has such a high retention and graduation rate.

- Prepare leaders who are future-focused and capable of fostering innovation and change.
- Promote a continuing cadre of educators who maintain active connections and collaboration with one another, with schools, communities and professional groups.
- Establish a higher education program that is technologically sophisticated, educationally effective and academically rigorous.
- Build a national reputation based upon action research.
