As a community, UNE is committed to nurturing well-rounded scholars and professionals who can adapt, prosper, and lead in a rapidly evolving world.



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

Accreditation & Recognition

Accreditation is the review of the quality of educational institutions and programs. In the United States, accreditation is a key measure used to identify institutions and programs that provide a high quality education.

NEW ENGLAND COMMISSION OF HIGHER EDUCATION

The University of New England is regionally accredited by the New England Commission of Higher Education (NECHE). NECHE is the federally-recognized regional accreditor for the six New England States, and was formerly known as the Commission on Institutions of Higher Education for NEASC. Regional accreditation is generally intended for non-profit academic schools (public or private), whereas national accreditation is generally for for-profit schools that offer vocational, career, or technical programs. Regional accreditation bodies tend to be older, more prestigious, and their standards are typically more stringent than national accreditation bodies.

COUNCIL ON EDUCATION FOR PUBLIC HEALTH

The Council on Education for Public Health (CEPH) is an independent agency recognized by the US Department of Education to accredit schools of public health and public health programs offered in settings other than schools of public health. The University of New England's public health program became accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health in 2011.

Graduate Programs in Public Health

MASTER OF PUBLIC HEALTH CURRICULUM STRUCTURE

The Master of Public Health degree is a 100% online, 46-credit graduate program designed to enhance your skills in a variety of public health areas. This convenient and flexible generalist degree program, focused on public health practice, provides students with the basic knowledge, skills and values to gain employment or get promoted in the burgeoning field of public health. The 46-credit Master of Public Health consists of:

9 CORE COURSES (27 CREDITS)

The 9 core courses that all MPH students are required to complete provide a strong foundational knowledge for you to build upon as you progress through the program and your career in public health.

APPLIED PRACTICE EXPERIENCE (APE) (3 CREDITS)

The APE is an opportunity to acquire 'real world' public health experience, apply concepts learned in class to actual projects, and explore different public health settings. Learn more about it here.

INTEGRATED LEARNING EXPERIENCE (ILE)

The ILE consists of a 1 credit planning course and a 3 credit project course. Students have three project course options to choose from; GPH 751 Advanced Policy Analysis, GPH 752 Advanced Research Methods, or GPH 753 Advanced Program Evaluation. The student will create a high-quality written document that synthesizes public health concepts reflecting competencies established by the program and The Council on Education for Public Health (CEPH).

4 ELECTIVE COURSES

- **Generalist Track:** Students select 4 elective courses to design their degree to align with their individual public health career ambitions.
- Epidemiology Focus Area: This focus area is a convenient way for you to specialize your MPH degree in epidemiology. Students who choose to focus in epidemiology select 3 epidemiology electives and 1 general elective. (In lieu of selecting a general elective, students can choose to take a fourth epidemiology elective.) Keep reading to learn more about whether our epidemiology focus area may be a good fit for you.




GRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN PUBLIC HEALTH

Admissions

WHAT THIS PROGRAM LOOKS FOR IN AN APPLICANT

Applicants from all undergraduate majors and backgrounds are encouraged to apply. Public health is a highly interdisciplinary field, and our programs are designed to benefit recent graduates, career changers, and those who are already working in the public health field.

Successful students appreciate the role of public health in building healthy and equitable communities and gain the skills and knowledge to pursue opportunities in a wide variety of public health settings.

Strong applicants display a solid mix of quantitative, writing, and critical thinking skills. Work, volunteering, research, and/ or internship experience relevant to public health and health equity are valued during the review process, but not required. We take a holistic approach to reviewing applications.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- **Bachelor's degree or above** from a regionally accredited U.S. college or university, or its equivalent.
 - See International Admissions for details regarding the evaluation of international degrees for grade and degree equivalency.
- Successful completion of an undergraduate degree, typically defined by a 3.0 cumulative GPA, or better.
 However, applications are reviewed holistically as a determination of academic readiness.
- Computer with an internet connection, including the hardware and software requirements described on the Technical Requirements page. Must also possess sufficient computer skills to navigate the internet as all classes are accessed 100% online.

Resources & Support

The University of New England is committed to student success, and we understand that success is directly related to the overall student experience. Therefore, we believe a successful student is a supported student. STUDENT SUPPORT SPECIALIST

A student support specialist is assigned to every individual student who enters the social work program in order to ensure their success. ACADEMIC ADVISING
